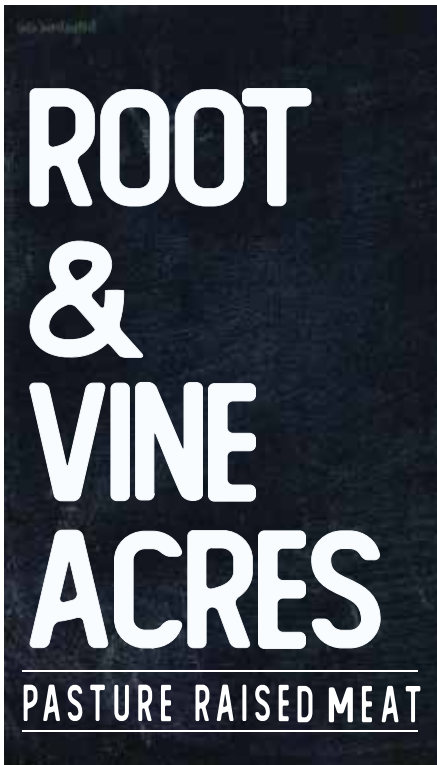

Rules and Regulations

Please read all rules carefully – all dates are for 2023

1. Entries must be made on official entry forms. Entry forms are available in the print version of this booklet, or at crestonvalleyfair.com.
One exhibitor only per entry form.
2. **Entry Fee - Scarecrow Contest \$5; All other entries \$2 first entry, .50 for each subsequent entry.**
3. To avoid double entries, a student **MUST** decide whether to enter in the Student or Open Section where the same class exists.
4. **To ensure that all entry forms are processed, please mail completed entry forms** to Box 95, Creston, BC, V0B 1G0 on or before **Monday Sept. 4**. Forms can also be dropped off at the Creston Visitors Centre by 4 p.m. on **Friday, Sept. 1**.
5. Exhibits **MUST** be brought into the Creston and District Community Complex (CDCC) between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 7. All exhibits are to be in place by 8 p.m. **All exhibitors must vacate the building by 8:30 p.m.** on Thursday.
6. Exhibits brought to the CDCC Thursday evening **which have not been processed** will be labelled "**For Display Only**" and **will not be judged**.
7. All individual exhibits **MUST** be grown or made by the exhibitor within the past year. **No person can have more than one entry in the same class**. Additional entries will be marked "**For Display Only**." **There will be no refund of entry fees paid.**
8. **LIVESTOCK ONLY** - Entry Deadline - To ensure adequate pens & cages, all Livestock Section entries must be submitted by **August 15**.
9. **ANIMAL MOVEMENT** - Small livestock must be brought into the CDCC on **Thursday, Sept. 7**. Large livestock is to be brought into the CDCC **Friday, Sept 8 no later than 9 a.m.** Any animal not in the fair by the times listed above will be disqualified.
10. **Large livestock** can be removed from the fair by **5 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 9**. **Small livestock** can be removed by **5:30 p.m.** **All animals must be removed from the premises by 6:30 p.m.**

11. Exhibitors with 20 or more entries may pick up their entry tags on **Wednesday, Sept. 6 between 7 & 9 p.m.** in the Erickson Room at the CDCC.
12. Award presentations will be at **4:30 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 9.**
13. Exhibits must not be removed before **5 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 9.** All exhibits must be picked up between **5 & 6:30 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 9.** The Creston Valley Fall Fair Association will not be responsible for items not picked up at this time.
14. In the absence of competition in any one class, the judges will give awards as they deem worthy. An only entry in any one class will not necessarily be given a ribbon.
15. All protests must be in writing & handed to the convenor in charge of the section by **7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 8.** The judge's decision will be final.
16. The Creston Valley Fall Fair Association will not be responsible for any loss, damage, or accident whatsoever in connection with the exhibits or property.
17. Points are awarded as follows:
 - 1st prize - 5 points
 - 2nd prize - 3 points
 - 3rd prize - 2 points
18. Points will be used to determine the Aggregate winners in all categories as noted on page 1 in this booklet - Trophies & Certificates to be Awarded and listed in each section in this booklet.
19. Prize money is awarded in conjunction with the points. Prize money must be picked up after the awards ceremony on **Saturday, Sept 9 by 6 p.m.** If not picked up, then all prize money will be donated back to the Creston Valley Fall Fair Association.

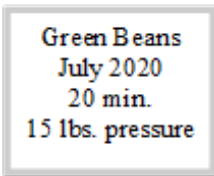

- All entries must have been preserved in the last 12 months.
- Only name brand canning jars accepted except where apesified. **Please note jar size required in each class.**

Division 2: Honey

Types of Honey:

Liquid Honey is extracted from the comb and strained to promote clarity. It may be heat treated to keep it liquid.

Creamed Honey is prepared by seeding liquid honey with finely granulated honey and storing it under controlled conditions until granulation is complete.

Comb Honey is natural honey sealed in wax, made by the bees in the hive.

Chunk Honey is a mixture of liquid honey and pieces of comb honey in a container.

Division 3: Home Cooking Made with Honey

Please note the recipe is to accompany the entry and honey must be the primary sweetener.

Tips for Baking with Honey

- Replace 1 cup of sugar for 1/2 cup of honey
- Reduce liquid called for by 1/4 cup for each cup of honey
- Reduce oven temperature by 25° F, but cook a little longer
- Add 1/2 tsp of baking soda per cup of honey to help the baking rise

Division 1: Cut Flowers

General Hints for Flower Entries

- **Freshness:** cut flowers in the late afternoon and put in warm water for best results in keeping them fresh.
- **Oasis** is very useful in flower arrangements.
- Please bring extra flowers in case some get damaged.

PLEASE NOTE: All containers are supplied in Classes 1-40 (Cut flowers)

Judging Criteria:

- Flowers must be in good condition, clean & bright
- Stems must be long, but in proportion to flower head
- There should be no insect or disease damage
- Unless otherwise stated, cut flowers may be displayed with their own foliage
- Please de-bud. Any bud showing color will be counted as another bloom and could be disqualified.

Best of Show - Classes 1-6 Asters:

1. Asters Double, under 3" head size, 5 blooms, same variety, Color Variation Allowed (CVA)
Flowers must be fully double, but showing no central disc
2. Asters, Double, over 3" head size, 5 blooms, same variety, CVA
3. Asters, Spider, over 3" head size, 3 blooms
4. Calendula, 6 blooms, with own foliage
5. Cosmos, Single, 3 blooms, CVA
Petals should be uniform solid color
6. Dianthus, Pinks, 5 stems, not debudded
Should be a strong fresh fragrance and a whorl of leaves at bottom of flower

Classes 7-15, Dahlias:

Must always be shown with foliage attached to the stem

7. Dahlia, Poms, not over 2" head, 3 blooms, CVA
8. Dahlia, Ball, 2-4", 3 blooms, CVA

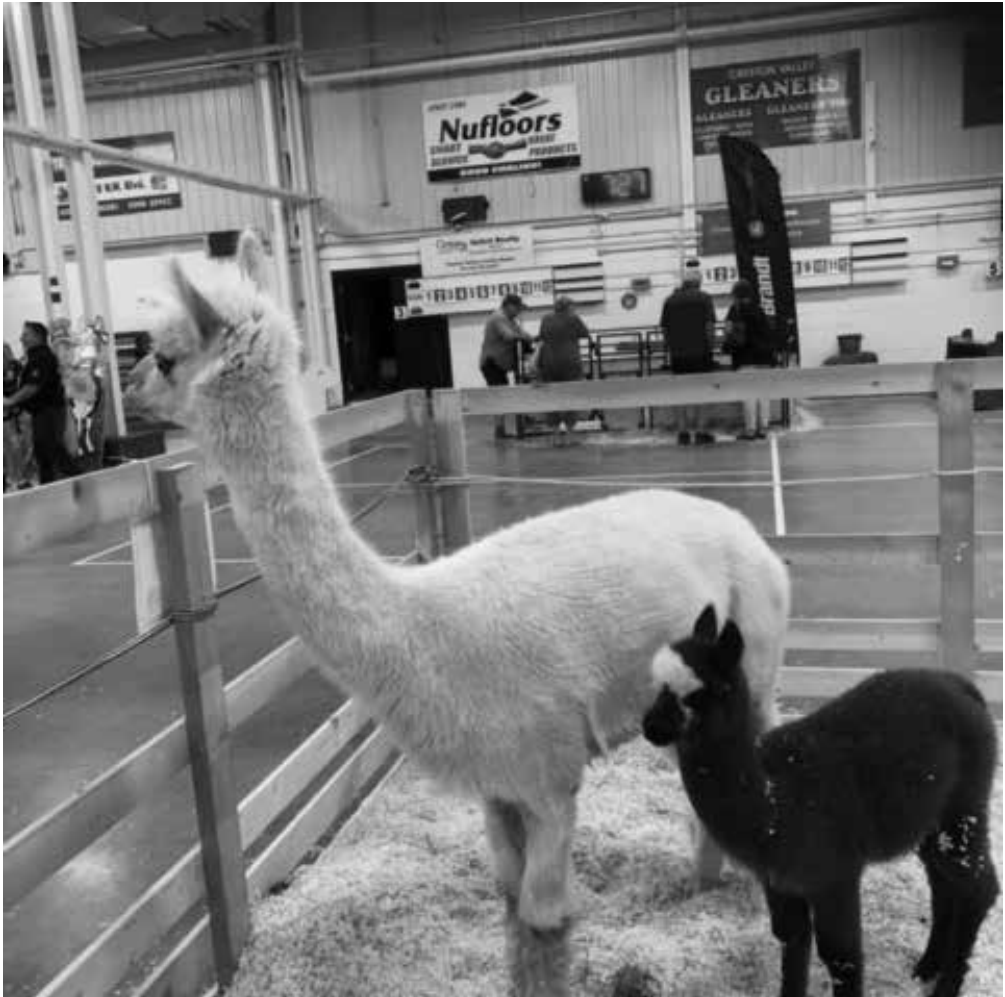
